Widening Our Welcome

In the fall, First Baptist went through the process of Widening Our Welcome and clarifying what we mean when we say, "We welcome people regardless of their sexual orientation." We spent time studying scripture, listening to the testimonies of LGBT individuals in our congregation, hearing from pastoral care professionals and from noted Baptist ethicist David Gushee. I have heard from many of you that this was a meaningful time of study and discernment.

First Baptist has a long history of recognizing God's love for all humanity and being a safe place for LGBT Christians to live out their faith. As a result of this history and the Widening our Welcome process, the Shepherding Team (Dave Bennett, Noah Hartsfield, Amanda Stone, Mary Lou Spradling and Khaki Westerfield) and the Church Council (Diana Groshong, Kee Groshong, Abby Hartsfield, Noah Hartsfield, Ross Kasmann, David Lang, Pam Humphreys, Justin Riley, Bob Stewart, Brian Steere, Khaki Westerfield) have affirmed the adoption of a clarification to our Welcome Statement that will be placed on our church website.

The First Baptist website, fbc-columbia.org, already has a page entitled "Beliefs" which states, We are a church that...

- ...blends biblical faith with intellectual integrity, respecting a person's right to think freely
- ...values everyone's gifts for service and leadership, both women and men
- ...welcomes all persons regardless of age, race, creed, gender, economic status or sexual orientation
- ...affirms spiritual experiences of new members from both Baptist and non-Baptist backgrounds
- ...values different expression of worshiping God, both contemporary and liturgical
- ...receives joy from intergenerational experiences and ministries
- ...celebrates and promotes Christ's call for social justice
- ...seeks to make a difference in our community and world
- ...is a family where joys, sorrows, hopes and dreams all meet at the table of our Lord
- ...understands that unity does not require uniformity.

We plan to add the statement:

• ...believes all people regardless of sexual orientation are created in the image of God; thus, all are welcomed to participate fully in the life of our church.

In addition, we are planning to add a statement to the website wedding page that says:

• Our sanctuary is open to both members and nonmembers, regardless of sexual orientation, for wedding ceremonies. (All couples are required to abide by the First Baptist wedding policies.)

On Tuesday, **January 26 at 5:30 pm** in the Fellowship Hall, you are invited to come and reflect on the Widening our Welcome process, to affirm the statement which will be added to our website, and to talk about how we move forward as a community where all are welcomed and included in the body of Christ. The Bible: Many Books, One Book

How are the ancient words and ideas of Scripture related to our 21st century world? Or do they relate at all? We have the Scriptures of our Bible but often have no idea how they relate to us and to each other. Do they tell one story or many conflicting stories?



Beginning Monday, January 25 at 1:00 pm, in the parlor, First Baptist will offer a 12-week overview of the Bible, our sacred Scriptures, as we have received them. We will consider the texts in their original oral as well as written settings with some discussion of the ancient world of the Bible. We will note the conversations occurring between the different writers & texts as they struggle to understand the God who claims them for His own people. We will look at the context of their writing and interaction with other oral traditions and written literature of their day.

The basis will be that these Scriptures are the Word of God and they are for all the people of God. They are to cause us to give thanks to our God for His gracious gift.



The class will be taught by David Gifford, a new member at First Baptist, who practiced gastroenterology for 30 years and also found time to do graduate work in Biblical studies at SWBTS. He has taught Bible classes in multiple Baptist & Methodist churches. His focus is on the text in its original setting as a way to better grasp and understand God's Word as it is received today. We look forward to having him teach at First Baptist.
