From the Pastor

Pastoral Residency Ministry Update

At the January church business meeting, First Baptist approved the Mission Team's proposal to begin a Pastoral Residency Ministry. Just as a reminder, in taking this step First Baptist is beginning to identify itself as a "teaching congregation," just as some hospitals are "teaching" hospitals with medical residents. The rigorous training afforded in seminaries and divinity schools focuses primarily on essential academic and biblical knowledge. What's missing is practical teaching about the work of the church. First Baptist is seeking to fill that gap by offering recent seminary or divinity school graduates two years to learn the ropes of local church ministry in a safe and healthy practicum.

Following the January business meeting, the Pastoral Residency Team immediately began sending information about our residency job opening to seminaries and divinity schools.

We are excited to announce that we received eight excellent resumes. In comparison, Wilshire Baptist Church in Dallas, which has had a residency ministry for 15 years, typically receives 8-12 resumes per year. Consequently, we were elated at the response that First Baptist received and impressed with the quality of the candidates. This speaks to the positive reputation of First Baptist Columbia in the wider Baptist world. The resumes included three men and five women from three different seminaries. The residency team has narrowed the pool of candidates to four. In the next two weeks, we will be checking references, listening to sermons, and doing interviews with these four candidates. We hope to bring the final candidate in for a visit in the next couple of months. Please be in prayer for the search process.

The Serving team is excited to announce our partnership with ForColumbia 2017, a city-wide, multi-church service opportunity on Saturday, April 29th. First Baptist will serve alongside 48 other churches and close to 2300 volunteers as we work together to share the love of Christ in our community.

Projects will include:

Adopting a room to refurbish at True North shelter.

True North is a ministry in Columbia that provides shelter and care for victims of domestic and sexual violence. Our goal will be to give this room our own version of an extreme

makeover. We need a team of 8 - 10 workers willing to help plan, paint, decorate, furnish, and fill this space with items designed to promote healing and restore dignity and value.

This project will involve clean up, painting, and construction of shelves to hold food items. This project will need 15 - 17 volunteers to work on various areas at the same time to facilitate the work.

- Staff continuing education
- Accountant fees
