I will be participating in Governing Board meetings prior to the Assembly. During the assembly, Brittany and I will be leading a workshop entitled Creating Experiential Worship in a Historic Baptist

Church. We will be talking about the research from my doctoral project and how First Baptist seeks to create worship that is multi-sensory, experiential, enhanced with art and other imagery, is more participatory in nature, and less clergy centric.

Michael McEntyre, our Associate Pastor for Youth, College, Young Adults and Missions, will be attending workshops on youth and missions ministry and will have a chance to connect with CBF Field Personnel from around the world.

Volunteer Background Checks

It is that time of year again! Once a year, First Baptist asks all our nursery, preschool, children and youth ministry volunteers to renew their background checks. All new volunteers are also asked to complete a background check before they begin to volunteer.

The safety and well-being of children and youth is essential; we want to do everything we can to protect children and youth while they are in our building and at church sponsored events. Background checks for volunteers are an important part of that protection. In addition, they are a standard best practice for ministry today.

The application and background check processes are handled through Protect My Ministry, a secure online service used by hundreds of churches and faith-based organizations. In the coming weeks, we will be distributing background check releases to all our volunteers. You can either bring it in a sealed envelope and place it in the offering plate on a Sunday morning or bring it to the church office.

Inclusion Training

August 2019

One focus area that came out of our All In Visioning process was "Work toward increased accessibility and inclusivity in First Baptist ministries and facilities." To do this, we have committed to expand opportunities for inclusion education and

experiences. We know that it takes intentionality to be a diverse community.

We have identified two areas of inclusion that we want to work on this summer. The first is inclusion of people with disabilities, particularly children. The Children's Ministry Team is already working to asses our current ministry and exploring ways to make it more accessible for children with disabilities. In addition, on August 18, during the small group hour, Christy Edwards, the mother of a special needs child, will talk about how churches can be supportive. Parenting a child who has autism or other special needs is challenging. Families often feel isolated and unwelcome within the church. We will be talking about how faith communities companion this growing population.

The second area of focus is the inclusion of transgender and nonbinary individuals. In 2014, First Baptist Widened Our Welcome and made it official that we would perform weddings for same-sex couples. At that time, our conversations focused on marriage equality. We took a deep dive into scripture, heard testimony from our gay and lesbian members and invited a therapist and a theologian to speak. Throughout all those conversations, we spent very little time talking about people who are transgender (a term used to describe people whose gender identity differs from the sex they were assigned at birth) and nonbinary (a term used by those who experience their gender identity and/or gender expression as falling outside the categories of male and female). The one Sunday that was supposed to be devoted to talking about transgender and nonbinary individuals, the guest speaker went in their own direction! Transgender and nonbinary individuals are among the world's most marginalized, misunderstood people. In 2017, advocates tracked at least 29 deaths of transgender people in the United States due to fatal violence. As a church that says we welcome LGBTQ+ individuals, we want to understand and learn how to be good allies. On August 4 and 11, Dr. Christy Hutton and Dr. Loren Bauerband will be leading the training.

Christy Edwards is a graduate of Truett Seminary and serves as a chaplain in Kansas City, MO. She is a regular contributing author for Baptist News Global. She is also the mother of a child with autism.

Christy Hutton, **Ph.D**. is a licensed psychologist at the University. She has a clinical specialty in working with LGBTQ clients. Christy is also a cofounder of the Parents for Parents support group, providing education and support to families with LGBTQ children of all ages.

Loren Bauerband, **PhD**. is an assistant professor University of Missouri. They have been researching the experiences and health of transgender and gender nonconforming individuals for over 7 years. Loren currently serves on the exec board for the Transgender Health Network in Columbia, MO.

Youth Ministry Workshop Summer Small Group

This summer we are beginning the work of reshaping our youth ministry (and possibly, by proxy, some of our children's ministry) future format and curriculum. This small group will help form and guide this process. Michael McEntyre will be leading the group with the

help of Stephen Hoell and Noah Hartsfield. Working with the input of the visioning process, we will be gathering to discuss the following:

June 16- Look at reshaping what and how we teach so that the church and our faith more holistically speaksinto the lives of students' identity formation. We want to broaden our influence beyond spirituality to include areas such as understanding self, sexuality, society, and social connections.

June 23- Discuss and identify possible spiritual anchor points and rituals to celebrate and imprint belonging and faith in our church and for families to engage in at home.

June 30- Brainstorm what we need as parents to help our families, our students, and our student ministry grow together and meet each other's needs.

July 7, 14, and 21- Intro the Journey to Adulthood curriculum that Michael has chosen to help guide our discussion and hopefully build our future framework on.

This is an exciting endeavor and we hope you will make an effort to join us this summer when in town. The group is open to everyone and we especially hope to hear from those in our congregation with kids (preschoolers to college students). We look forward to seeing what God (and you all) create for our students here at First Baptist.







Summer Book Club


