Personnel Task Force Letter from Church Moderator

First Baptist Church Community,

As you all know, we currently have a number of interim staff members: Michael McEntyre is serving as our Interim of Administration; Brittany McDonald Null, as Interim Assistant Pastor; and Marques J. Ruff, as Interim Music Director-Traditional. The interims have done an amazing job, giving us the opportunity to take our time, pray and think about our staffing needs going forward.

The Church Council has had a couple of good conversations about our staffing needs and the desire ensure that we hire the staff we really need going forward, a staff which matches our vision for the future.



At the last Church Council meeting, the council decided to form a taskforce to look at the church's staffing needs from a holistic perspective. The job of the taskforce is to look at what all our staff members do to get a bird's eye view of their work. They will also take into account what we learned through the All-In Church-Wide Visioning process about our dreams for the future. Their goal is to recommend to the Church Council the kinds of positions we should hire permanently.

John Shrum and Randy Wyatt from the Church Council, Charles Hunter and Mary Beth Ming from Personnel Committee and a representative from the Finance Committee have agreed to serve on this taskforce. The taskforce is beginning its work next week by meeting with our current church staff to understand everything they do. The taskforce plans to bring a recommendation to the Church Council in early 2020 so that we can move forward with hiring. Please give them your prayers as they undertake this important work for First Baptist Church.

Jesus' Family Tree: A Vulnerable Geneology

2019 Advent Sermon Series December 1-29

Our Advent worship theme this year is Jesus' Family Tree: A Vulnerable Genealogy. We will explore the genealogy of Jesus from Matthew Chapter 1. Matthew opens his account of Jesus' life with a list of names: the genealogy of Jesus' family on his father Joseph's side. At first glance these verses appear to be a simple collection of names and seem kind of boring, but these verses, like Mary, are pregnant with hidden treasure. Specifically, these verses mention five women and their families. In a time



when genealogies didn't normally contain even a single female name, why are these women included? These particular women, Tamar, Rahab, Ruth, Bathsheba, and Mary are all vulnerable- either young or poor, two are widows, all are disenfranchised.

We invite you to read the stories of these women and their families for yourself, and learn about Jesus' vulnerable genealogy, as we prepare our hearts for the birth of the Christ once again. Throughout Advent, these women will come to life in monologues dramatically portrayed by First Baptist members during worship.

VAC Family Christmas 2019

First Baptist is sponsoring 3 families this year through VAC's Holiday Program. Voluntary Action Center (VAC) is a non-profit that exists to help low-income individuals and families bridge the gap between crisis and stability and improve quality of life in Boone County. Each year VAC coordinates the collection and distribution of food and gifts for approximately 4,000 people during the holiday season. First Baptist is participating again in this needed ministry. In addition to toys, books, and games, families often receive needed clothing and household supplies through this program. Cards with individual gift requests will be available Sunday, November 24 on the bulletin board, in the hallway, outside



the Sanctuary. Get involved by choosing an item that you would like to donate, take the card, then return the purchased item to the church by December 8. Items do not need to be wrapped but we do ask that you include the card from the bulletin board with your gift. If you do not have time to shop but still want to participate, you can make a monetary donation by December 1. Simply indicate "VAC Family Christmas" on your check or offering envelope. A few of our "shopping elves" will be making a trip to pick up last minute items.
