Trustee Update

The trustees are always at work, making improvements to the building. 1) New doors are being installed on the south Waugh St. entry of the sanctuary. The old original doors have been vandalized numerous times, but the most recent attempt to break in damaged the doors beyond repair. 2) The front yard is being dug up. The city discovered that our drains in front of the Education Building send water to the sewage infrastructure of downtown and they required that we correct the problem. To do so, workers are digging down about 4 feet, connecting new drain pipe to the old plumbing which will then be routed towards Broadway where the storm water will flow onto the street. This is a \$10,000 fix that the Finance Committee approved as an emergency Endowment request. 3) And while all of that is taking place roofers were here to prepare bids for fixing the small flat roofs around the steeple.

Things are beginning to shape up in our new kitchen. Many thanks to David Lang who spent the better part of a day with me installing shelves in our new small storage closet in the Fellowship Hall. Then, under the guidance of Diana Groshong, all of the dishes stored away prior to renovation of the fellowship hall were unpacked. Some have been sold, some cleaned and some are in process of moving to new areas of storage. She also called in Donna Ross, Mary Lou Spradling, Esther Rollins, Oleta Forsee and Kee Groshong to help unpack and clean new kitchen pots, pans and utensils. Special thanks also to Madison Reynolds, Administrative Assistant and Brenda Rice, Project Coordinator who have done amazing cleanup work and have been invaluable assistants through this process. We're not done, but we're moving forward.

Coming soon - a revamp of our office space. You'll be seeing more details as we move along in that project.
