Cooperative Baptist Fellowship Affirming Network

Our church has chosen to continue our partnership with CBF to be a voice that continues to help all of God's children see that God can make space for everyone at the table. With that in mind, the Serving Team at First Baptist voted in May to financially support the formation of the Affirming Network of the Cooperative Baptist Fellowship. This network, comprised of LGBTQ+ persons and allies, is designed to be a space for churches to gather and share resources for inclusion, and where LGBTQ+ seminarians can connect with churches that will affirm their call to ministry.
