Bios of our CBF Field Personnel

Keith Holmes and Mary Van Rheenen were commissioned by the Cooperative Baptist Fellowship in 1996. They serve as resource coordinators to the Romany ministry group.

Keith Holmes is from Baton Rouge, Louisiana, but has lived in the Netherlands since 1996. He earned his M.A. in anthropology, minor in linguistics, from Louisiana State in 1987, where he met his future wife, Mary Van Rheenen. Mary is also an anthropologist, focusing on cultural identity. Keith did his linguistic fieldwork among the Garifuna (Black Carib) of Belize, Central America, and also worked in Korea for two years. Keith's main task is to provide and distribute culturally appropriate media resources for Romany Christians and others working to evangelize and disciple Romany. Additionally, Keith serves as a recording specialist for Faith Comes By Hearing and records the New Testament in European languages as well as Romany languages.

Mary was born in Michigan, grew up in Illinois, and received her BA from Northwestern College in Iowa. She served two years with the Mennonite Central Committee in Louisiana, worked with marketing folk arts in Louisiana and Illinois, and taught three years at Northwestern, the last year together with Keith. Since being commissioned by CBF, Mary has focused on Romany education and Romany-related projects in the Republic of Moldova. The Holmes/Van Rheenens have two grown daughters, Ellen and Rebecca, both of whom live in the Netherlands.

Christianity & Transgender Inclusion Event – February 21 & 22

Join us for an ecumenical event focused on Christianity and Transgender Inclusion. Our guest speaker, transgender theologian, Austen Hartke, will be leading us for this two-day event. Austen is a graduate of Luther Seminary's Master of Arts program in Old Testament and Hebrew Bible Studies, and author of *Transforming: The Bible and the Lives of Transgender Christians*. An LGBTQ+ Affirming Worship Service will be held at 6:30 pm on Friday, February 21, after which Hartke will share his coming out story and talk about the biblical stories that give him strength as an adult in a session called *Transgender and Christian: A Coming Out and Coming Home Story*. On Saturday, February 22, at 10:00 am, Hartke will lead *The Bible and Transgender Christian's Seminar* in a session that explores the biblical texts historically used to discriminate against the LGBTQ+ community.
