Street Theology - Joining God's Mission as We Go



God invites us to join in the work of reconciling all of creation. Which means, church isn't meant to be just a once-a-week gathering but a community that emphasizes an incarnational, servant approach to all of life.

This summer, we invite you to join in a dialogue about viewing our lives together through four theological lenses that help frame what we are called to be as disciples of Jesus and co-creators with God as we go. It is street theology - joining God's mission as we go, wherever we are!

From June 3-July 15, our Sunday Morning Adult Small Groups will be coming together and gathering in the parlor at 10:15 for a combined small group series entitled Street Theology-

Joining God's Mission as We Go. For the first few weeks, Rev. Brian Ford, a regular attendee at Awakening Worship, will be leading us; then, Associate Pastor Michael McEntyre will take some of what was discussed and talk about how it applies to our approach for ministry with the Lakota people in South Dakota.



What will church be like while I am on sabbatical?

As you know, I am leaving for sabbatical on May 28 and will be back August 20. That sounds like a long time, but it will fly by. However, it does raise the question: who is going to take care of all the stuff that I do? Let me give you some answers regarding some key areas: preaching and worship leadership, pastoral care (funerals, hospital visits and homebound care), leadership of the staff and of the church.

Preaching and Worship Leadership:

We have a great line-up of guest preachers scheduled. You can see their bios in this [Spire](#). In addition, part of our Pastoral Residency program curriculum is to ask our Resident to preach a series of sermons over 3-week period to allow her to experience the demand of weekly sermon writing on top of regular pastoral duties. My sabbatical is a great opportunity for Pastoral Resident Brittany McDonald Null to meet this requirement. Our Associate Pastor Ed Rollins will continue to plan Traditional Worship; and Brittany, with input from Shelby Myers our Praise Band Director, will plan Awakening Worship. Brittany will also serve as the main liturgist during worship - greeting, introducing guest preachers, leading pastoral prayers, doing the benediction, and so forth.



Pastoral Care:

What about people who are in the hospital during the sabbatical, or what if there is a death in our church family? Associate Pastors Ed Rollins and Michael McEntyre and Pastoral Resident Brittany McDonald Null will be available. We have an amazing pastoral staff; if you need a pastor, you will be taken care of. Brittany will also be checking on our homebound members.

Leadership of Staff:

Ed Rollins will be supervising the staff and running our weekly staff meeting. The personnel committee, chaired by Charles Hunter, is available if needed.

Leadership of the Church:

Ed Rollins and Michael McEntyre will oversee the day-to-day activities of the church. The Church Council is the governing body of the church and Khaki Westerfield is the Church Moderator. Any needs that arise that would require their attention can be addressed in a summer meeting.

A Few Other Tasks:

Brittany McDonald Null will be following up with worship guests and overseeing outreach. She will also be filling in for me during the Critical Conversation events with Second Baptist and Broadway Christian. Michael McEntyre will be working with the Pastoral Residency Team and will be pastoral liaison for Kids Camp. Rev. Brian Ford has graciously agreed to meet with Brittany for "Homiletics and Pastoral Life," which is our weekly meeting that is one-part supervision and one-part teaching time about the life and work of a pastor.

I am grateful for the gift of a sabbatical. We have a very capable staff and plans are in place to make sure the church is taken care of. Plus, you are the Body of Christ; I have great confidence in each of you to care for the community and give leadership in my absence. For me, honoring the Sabbath (and my sabbatical) means relinquishing control and letting go of the illusion that I am indispensable. I know God will take care of First Baptist while I'm away.

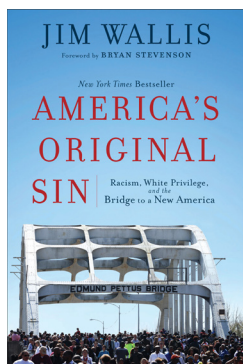
The church office will be closed for Memorial Day. We wish you a blessed Memorial Day as our veterans are honored!

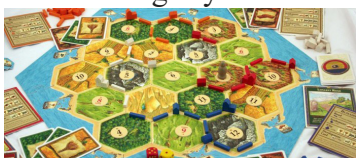
Critical Conversations in Troubled Times

Meet Our Speakers

While Pastor Carol is on sabbatical during the summer, we will be in good hands as several very capable people fill the pulpit. Brittany McDonald Null will bring the message several times, interspersed with several speakers known either for their involvement in the Baptist denomination, our local community, or both. In order of appearance, they are:



Rev. Brian Ford became the Executive Director of Churchnet in April 2017. Previously he was pastor of Little Bonne Femme Baptist Church in Columbia. Brian is currently an adjunct professor at Central Baptist Theological Seminary in Shawnee KS. Brian is married to the former Holly Williams of Lamar, MO. She is currently an OB/GYN physician for the University of Missouri Health Sciences in Columbia. They have two children, Caroline & Owen. In his spare time, he enjoys spending time with family, playing golf, watching movies, traveling, reading, fishing, hunting, & attempting to play the guitar.

Nick Foster is the Executive Director of Voluntary Action Center (VAC). Foster assumed his role with VAC in 2011. Prior to that he was the executive director of Habitat for Humanity of Morgan County, Indiana. He moved to Columbia in 2010 when his wife, Candace Kuby, took a faculty position as an assistant professor of early childhood education at the University of Missouri.



Foster has also served as pastor at University Baptist Church in Montevallo, Alabama; he later served with Passport, Inc. in Birmingham as a camp coordinator and project director. Foster also is known as a storyteller, speaking in a variety of settings nationwide.

Reverend Muriel L. Johnson is an ordained American Baptist Minister who accepted her call into ministry in 1989. She is the first woman licensed by Mt. Zion Baptist Church in Madison WI, where she is affectionately referred to as the "First Daughter" of the church. For the past 15 years, she has served as a Regional Associate Minister (The first African American to do so) for the American Baptist Churches of the Great River Region. In essence, her ministry charge is to "CARE" (Challenge, Assist, Represent and Equip) for congregations and clergy as they live out the Gospel of Jesus Christ together in word and deed. She teaches and preaches the Gospel of Jesus Christ with detailed attention to the sacred text, a sensitivity of the human predicament and a great sense of humor. Reverend Johnson currently resides in Columbia, Missouri and is blessed with one adult daughter, Aisha and Godson, Corvonn, as well as an almost 14-year-old grandson, Maurice, all of whom make her heart smile.



Sabbatical Preachers



Jeff Langford began serving as the coordinator of Cooperative Baptist Fellowship-Heartland in 2016 after working as the organization's associate coordinator for 12 years. A graduate of University of Central Missouri and Purdue University, Jeff lives in Liberty, MO with his wife, Sara, a high school math teacher. He is a member at Second Baptist Church in Liberty, where he teaches the Winepress Bible study class for adults and serves as the church moderator. In his spare time, he enjoys graphic design, reading and digging holes for Sara's garden. Jeff and Sara's three sons – Ian (22), Seth (20) and Isaac (15) – are all taller than their parents.



Clanton C.W. Dawson, Jr. PhD is Pastor, President, and CEO of Dawson Journeys Ministry, a Christian, multicultural, multi-generational ministry of hope. He is also the Pastor of Mt. Calvary Baptist Church in Marshall, MO. Dr. Dawson is Adjunct Associate Professor of Philosophy at Moberly Area Community College (Columbia Campus) and Columbia College. He also serves as President of the African American Clergy Coalition of Mid-Missouri and is a Board member of Missouri Faith Voices.



Dr. Dawson is a powerful preacher with a gift for inspiring hope in the heart and soul of the listener. He is a published writer and is currently a weekly columnist for the Columbia Missourian. He and his wife, Maria Hughes Dawson, are the proud parents of 11 children, grandparents of 19, and have one great-grandchild.



Dr. David May, Director of the Master of Arts (Theological Studies), has taught at Central Baptist Theological Seminary since 1994. His writings include *Preaching Matthew: Interpretation and Proclamation*, co-written with Mike Graves. Dr. May is active in the Society of Biblical Literature, the National Association of Baptist Professors of Religion, and the American Schools of Oriental Research. Drawing upon almost 50 years of playing tennis, he continues to enjoy both competitive and recreational play. He is an avid reader, and has collected first edition books from numerous authors, and his interest in the biblical world of the first century stimulates his study of ancient Roman and Judean coins related to the New Testament era. He appreciates computer technology of the 21st century while also finding time to restore vintage fountain pens. Dr. May and his wife Pam live in Atchison KS; both are natives of Missouri, and their hometown is Maryville. Pam is the Ministry Assistant for Finances at Second Baptist Church in Liberty.

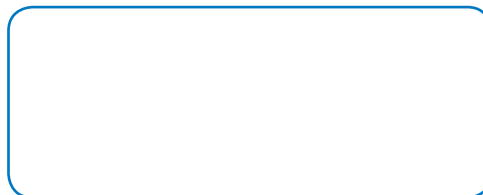
