Zoom at Noon will not be meeting on July 22. The group will resume on July 29.

Worship Service Options Beginning August 9

We are excited to announce that beginning Sunday, August 9 at 9:15 am, we are planning to host in-person worship services on the front lawn of the church building. Since March, the Church Council has met regularly to discuss the possibility of resuming in-person worship. A growing consensus exists among experts, which suggests if Americans are going to leave their homes, it is safer to be outside than indoors where fresh air and more space between people can help mitigate the risk of spreading COVID-19. Additionally, since the HVAC systems in the sanctuary and Fellowship Hall only recirculate air, simply sucking the air in from the room, cooling it and then, pushing it back out into the room, we feel even with social distancing measures it is not our best option at this time. Based on these factors and the uptick of COVID-19 cases in Columbia, the Church Council believes gathering outdoors on the front lawn is the safest option for now.

We are excited about the opportunity to gather in-person and plan to host outdoor services each Sunday (weather permitting) at 9:15 am beginning August 9. We will rotate the music leadership of the service every few weeks to allow for a variety of musical styles to be experienced in-person. Our 11:15 am service will continue to be tailored to an online experience and will also rotate the music leadership of that service to complement and allow for our in-person service. The guidelines for in-person gatherings on the front lawn will apply to the 9:15 am worship services as well. We understand that despite all our precautions, inperson gathering still elevate risks of exposure and encourage our church members to make choices based on what is best for you and your family.

Guest Preacher for July 26 Online Service

Several months ago, I invited Dr. Terrell Carter to be our guest preacher in July because I was planning to be out of town attending a conference. Of course, my conference is cancelled, but I couldn't pass up the chance to hear from Dr. Carter and am trilled he has agreed to join us for online worship as our guest preacher on July 26 at 11:15 am.

Terrell Carter, DMin, is pastor of Webster Groves Baptist Church in Webster Groves, MO and Chief Diversity Officer and Special Advisor to the President at Greenville University in Greenville, IL. Dr. Carter has an extensive writing ministry. His latest book The Only Thing that Matters is Heaven: Rethinking Sin, Death, Hell, Redemption, and Salvation for All Creation is currently available through traditional booksellers.

ForColumbia Service Opportunity - August 1

Covid-19 put a halt to our plans to return to Benton Elementary this past April to help create a new outdoor learning classroom for the students. However, under the current guidelines for the city, we are planning to be able to move forward with this project on August 1 with a smaller team of folks following the appropriate precautions. The work will include moving some fencing and installing new sections; spreading mulch in a large area that will include several new "play elements" for this outdoor classroom; painting some of the play elements of the outdoor classroom; general yard clean-up of the property.

<u>Guest Speaker – Conversation on Christian Nationalism</u> August 9 & 16

On August 9 and 16 at 10:15 am via zoom, Brian Kaylor will be our guest speaker for a conversation on Christian Nationalism. Christian Nationalism is an ideology, which seeks to merge Christian and American identities and in doing so, distorts both the Christian faith and America's constitutional democracy. Christian Nationalism equates being a Christian with being and American and asserts that Christianity should be privileged by the State over other religions. Christian Nationalism implies that to be a good American, one must be Christian.

In the last few years, we have seen a rise in legislation around the country, and in Missouri, which attempts to advance the cause of Christian Nationalism. Some Christians have launched an effort known as "Project Blitz" in hopes of fusing Christianity and American Civic Life. Lawmakers in more than a dozen states used model bills from *Project Blitz*, on topics like encouraging classes on "Bible literacy" in public schools and mandating public schools post "In God We Trust." In April of 2019, our Pastor Carol McEntyre testified in Jefferson City against one of these bills, a biblical literacy bill, which encourages public schools to teach the Bible. Baptists have historically stood for religious liberty for all, and believed that everyone should be free to practice their faith or to have no faith if they so choose. Faith should never be coerced. We hope you will join us for this important conversation about religious liberty for all!

The Color of Compromise Study Expands and Resumes

Prior to the Covid-19 pandemic, a small group was meeting to talk about *The Color of Compromise* a book and video study by Jemar Tisby, which takes readers on a historical journey: from America's early colonial days through slavery and the Civil War, covering the tragedy of Jim Crow laws and the victories of the Civil Rights era, to today's Black Lives Matter movement. Author Jemar Tisby reveals the obvious—and the far more subtle—ways the American church has compromised what the Bible teaches about human dignity and equality.

The group lead by Lynne Lampe and Julie Walker are planning to restart their discussion of *The Color of Compromise* in August via Zoom. They are also planning to do some research on racism in Columbia and First Baptist's response throughout the years.
