Visual Worship Enhancements: The theme for our Lenten journey, the six weeks prior to Easter, "The Way," was built upon scripture passages related to Christ's journey in ministry and life. The pathway you see hanging in the Chancel and leading to the cross was painted by Meridith Green. With the assistance of Brenda Rice, we have added each week to the path so that it seems that we are on a journey to the cross. Stepping stones along the path were constructed by Ash Wednesday worship participants. The starkness of the path relates to our thematic scripture, Isaiah 43:19, "I will make a way in the wilderness and rivers in the desert." (Thus, the blue water running across the path.)

On Easter, we cover the pathway with new life, flowers of many shapes and sizes. The artistic "sunrise" (designed by Michael McEntyre and our youth) symbolizes the new dawn of Christ's work and mission in our world.

Guest musicians this morning include Matt Fetterly, Nick Smith, Ryan Iadanza, and Erica Manzo. The timpani, a new addition to our music ministry thanks to Lisa Dobbs, are being played for the first time in worship.
