
We pray for those who have no home, no land, no food, no work, no medicine, no peace. May we recognize and serve Christ in the suffering and the needy.

Lenten Pilgrimage: Walking with People in Poverty will take place each Wednesday from March 12 to April 9 at 5:30 pm. This Lenten Pilgrimage is a bit different. It will begin with **The Walk** on Sunday afternoon, March 9, at Wilkes Boulevard United Methodist Church. The Walk exposes people to the experience of traveling from place to place throughout Columbia to meet basic needs: for food, clothing and shelter. It is a two-mile walk with stops at many of the places where people in poverty go for assistance. **Space for this event is limited.** To sign up for The Walk send an email to Carol McEntyre at mcentyre@fbc-columbia.org.

There is also a Wednesday night study, which will be an extension of the topics introduced with the Walk. **You do not have to participate in The Walk to take part in the Wednesday night study.** Session One will be led by Brian Ford, Pastor of Little Bonne Femme Baptist Church. During Sessions Two and Three, we will preview the new film *American Winter*. Other sessions will include a discussion of what the Bible says about caring for people in poverty, playing the game of life in poverty and a look at local justice issues.
