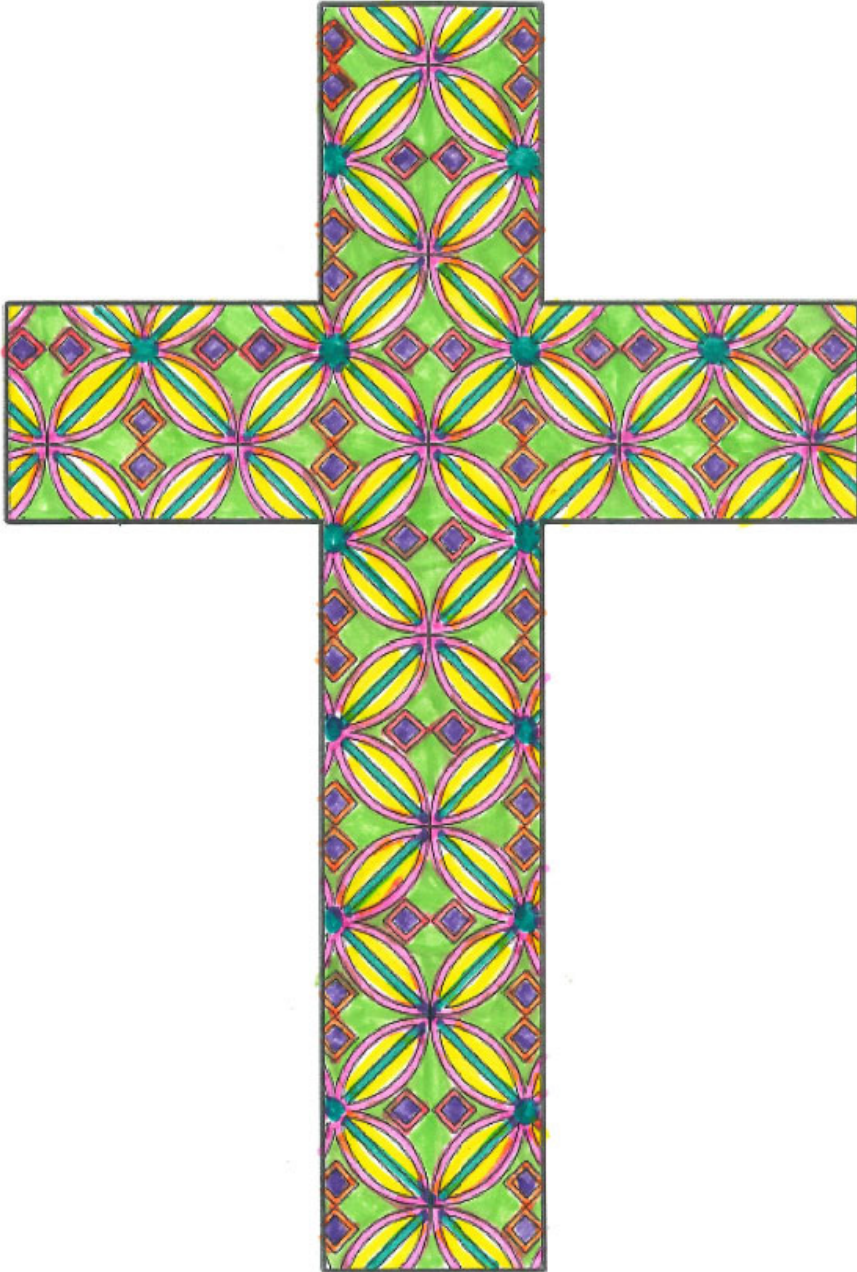

Renewal of Our Church Covenant (unison)


Because we have responded to Christ's call to follow him as disciples and because we find this calling too difficult and too important to fulfill alone,
