Hanging of the Green & New Sermon Series Begin December 1

Our Advent worship theme this year is *Jesus' Family Tree: A Vulnerable Genealogy*. We will explore the genealogy of Jesus from Matthew Chapter 1. Matthew opens his account of Jesus' life with a list of names: the genealogy of Jesus' family on his father Joseph's side. At first glance these verses appear to be a simple collection of names and seem kind of boring, but these verses, like Mary, are pregnant with hidden treasure. Specifically, these verses mention five women and their families. In a time when genealogies didn't normally contain even a single female name, why are these women included? These particular women, Tamar, Rahab, Ruth, Bathsheba, and Mary are all vulnerable- either young or poor, two are widows, all are disenfranchised. Join us as we adorn our spaces for Advent and kick-off this series.

Children's Ministry Listening Sessions- December 8 & 15

On Sundays, December 8 and 15 in the Conference Room, during the 10:15 am Spiritual Formation Hour, the Children's Ministry Task Force will be hosting listening sessions for parents of children 3-years-old through 5th grade and anyone else interested in providing insight and input into the Children's Ministry. During these each of these two Sundays, the Task Force will host a qualitative needs assessment to hear what brings you and yours to Sunday School and other First Baptist Children's Ministry events, as well as provide space for honest feedback and suggestions. We hope you can attend one of these Sundays.

Christmas Dinner- December 15

On Sunday, December 15 at 5:00 pm is First Baptist's Annual Christmas Dinner. Come prepared for a lovely meal in the Fellowship Hall with turkey, ham, and beverages provided by the church and wonderful side dishes and desserts made by you and your First Baptist friends. We will sing carols and hear musical offerings from our First Kid's Choir. We hope you will join us.

VAC Family Christmas 2019

First Baptist is sponsoring 3 families this year through VAC's Holiday Program. Voluntary Action Center (VAC) is a non-profit that exists to help low-income individuals and families bridge the gap between crisis and stability and improve quality of life in Boone County. Each year VAC coordinates the collection and distribution of food and gifts for approximately 4,000 people during the holiday season. First Baptist is participating again in this needed ministry. In addition to toys, books, and games, families often receive needed clothing and household supplies through this program. Cards with individual gift requests will be available Sunday, November 24 on the bulletin board, in the hallway, outside the Sanctuary. Get involved by choosing an item that you would like to donate, take the card, then return the purchased item to the church by December 8. Items do not need to be wrapped but we do ask that you include the card from the bulletin board with your gift. If you do not have time to shop but still want to participate, you can make a monetary donation by December 1. Simply indicate "VAC Family Christmas" on your check or offering envelope. A few of our "shopping elves" will be making a trip to pick up last minute items. For Children During Worship:

<u>Birth-Kindergarteners</u> can be checked in at the nursery, located next to the sanctuary, where they will be cared for by our professional staff.
