Gospel Reading Bryce Null

Matthew 2:1-12

In the time of King Herod, after Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judea, wise men from the East came to Jerusalem, asking, "Where is the child who has been born king of the Jews? For we observed his star at its rising, and have come to pay him homage." When King Herod heard this, he was frightened, and all Jerusalem with him; and calling together all the chief priests and scribes of the people, he inquired of them where the Messiah was to be born. They told him, "In Bethlehem of Judea; for so it has been written by the prophet:

'And you, Bethlehem, in the land of Judah, are by no means least among the rulers of Judah; for from you shall come a ruler who is to shepherd my people Israel."

Then Herod secretly called for the wise men and learned from them the exact time when the star had appeared. Then he sent them to Bethlehem, saying, "Go and search diligently for the child; and when you have found him, bring me word so that I may also go and pay him homage." When they had heard the king, they set out; and there, ahead of them, went the star that they had seen at its rising, until it stopped over the place where the child was. When they saw that the star had stopped, they were overwhelmed with joy. On entering the house, they saw the child with Mary his mother; and they knelt down and paid him homage. Then, opening their treasure chests, they offered him gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh. And having been warned in a dream not to return to Herod, they left for their own country by another road.

Invitation to Holy Communion (responsive)

Since his birth, with the visit of the wise ones, strangers from the East, Jesus was not content to limit his welcome and message to his own people. Jesus was one who reached across human borders and boundaries, seeing in everyone a common heritage as a child of God. Whether it was magi from the East, or a woman from Samaria, or a leper from a nearby colony, Jesus welcomed them all.

We remind one another: Jesus welcomes everyone at this table.

No one is turned away.

If you seek God's presence, come and eat.

If you are hungry for this spiritual food, come and eat.

If you have questions and doubts, come and eat.

If you feel unworthy, come and eat.

This table is spread for all of us that we each might experience God's abundant and unconditional love.

By the light of the star,

God led travelers to the Christ child.

When they saw the child

they were overwhelmed with joy.

By the light of divine love,

God leads us to this holy meal.

Gathered together, we encounter the living Christ and taste the deepest joy.

So now, gathered around this table, we recall and recount how the Epiphany God was made known in the actions and words of Jesus as he shared a last supper with his friends:

We remember how the humble service of washing feet revealed the shape of God's Kingdom;

How the blessing, breaking and sharing of bread revealed the pattern of God's life;

how the blessing, pouring and sharing of wine revealed the depth of God's love;

and recalling and treasuring these things we join our voices with those of all creation in recognition and celebration of the grace and goodness of God present and at work in the world.

Holy, holy, holy Lord, God of power and might, heaven and earth are full of your glory.

Epiphany God, send down your Holy Spirit now on us, and on these gifts of bread and cup, that we might recognize and know you are present with us here, and in receiving the gifts of our love, find ourselves renewed. **Amen.**
